April 4th Guest Speaker Bio: Deborah Ash

Deb Ash is a Registered Nurse (RN) with a master’s degree in Nursing (RN, MSN) and also in Business Administration (MBA). Deb graduated from Duke University’s Legal Nurse Consulting (LNC) program. She has been certified as a Correctional Health Care Professional (CCHP) through the National Commission of Correctional Health Care (NCCHC) for over ten years. In 2022, Deb obtained the highest level of certification through NCCHC as a CCHP-RN. Deb was inducted into the Sigma Theta Tau International Nursing Honor’s Society for her outstanding academic performance. Deb is an established and respected speaker on issues related to correctional health care. She has been a returning speaker for state sheriff’s and jail administrator associations in 17 states. Over the past seven years, Deb has given 12 educational presentations for the NCCHC and has been invited to return again this year. In addition to correctional nurse training, Deb’s trainings usually focus on the roles and responsibilities of correctional officers, but she also trains nurses and physicians to understand the nuances of the jail environment.

Deb possesses an in-depth understanding of the unique challenges for providing health care services to our incarcerated population. She is well-versed in the state, local and federal correctional agencies, including Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), United States Marshal Services (USMS), and a number of states for the Department of Corrections (DOC). Deb is familiar with state nursing and provider standards and is considered an expert for interpretation of their practice acts. Deb has successfully assisted county jails in multiple states through the accreditation process through ACA, NCCHC and certification in the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA).

April 5th Guest Speaker Bio: Michael J. Mirarchi

Michael J. Mirarchi is recognized as a leading expert in employment-related lawsuit prevention. As an Employee Relations Counselor, he is dedicated to helping employers stay litigation-free. Drawing from over 30 years of experience in employment and labor law, as an employer defense attorney and as a Human Resources Vice President, he developed a unique litigation avoidance program. He has presented his “Reset the Clock” program over 1,100 times to more than 26,000 leaders at employer facilities across North America. He has delivered this program to Departments of Public Safety, police departments and law enforcement associations (IACP, ILEA, LEMIT) across the U.S. Through it, leaders in law enforcement acquire significantly increased practical knowledge and a higher level of confidence in addressing employee relations issues than they have ever had before.

Mr. Mirarchi believes that the vast majority of leaders in public safety want to exercise their abilities with fairness, integrity and professionalism. Nevertheless, if you lead people long enough, there are plenty of opportunities to run into potential liability situations. In these situations, leaders who know what to do and how to do it have a tremendous advantage over those who don’t, in avoiding lawsuits. In 2013, Mike was recognized as the first inductee into the HR Southwest Conference Speaker Hall of Fame. Over the last 25 years, he has consistently been one of the highest-rated speakers, excelling in content, professionalism and delivery. In conjunction with various employer, industry and professional associations, he has conducted live TV broadcasts, webinars and on-line employee relations programs, in addition to presenting at their regional and national conferences. Mr. Mirarchi has a B.S. in Business Administration and a Law Degree from Seton Hall University.
